Aghabullogue played with the wind in the first half; however it was Newtownshandrum who recorded the first score of the game with a point from play. This was the only time that Newtownshandrum lead for the duration of the game as Aghabullogue showed great skill, tenacity and determination and took the game to Newtownshandrum. Aileen Twomey recorded Aghabullogue's first score with an impressive goal and this score was quickly followed with equally impressive points from Michelle Healy, Ciara Murphy and Aileen Twomey.
